

2022 Grand Lodge Convention

The Grand Lodge convened in Cleveland, OH, on January 27, 2022, presided over by outgoing Grand President **Joseph C. Ruch**, who served two years as a result of the COVID pandemic. He reported, "This past year, I have been little more than custodian to this Grand Lodge office. We as an organization, along with the nation and the entire world, continue to struggle through this pandemic... To the mariners who every day are but a few feet from disaster, yet continue to bring the goods that help sustain us, I give thanks... There have been 113 Grand Presidents before me; may there be 113 more to follow."

Grand Secretary-Treasurer **Brian Eickel** indicated that membership totaled 539 as of December 31, 2021. This was a decrease of five members from a year earlier.

NELC Chairman Scott Skrzypczak presented both the Canadian and US NELC reports. He noted that efforts in general have been to continue to refine electronic navigation systems throughout the Great Lakes as new technologies are rolled out. Seann O'Donoughue, Canadian NELC chair, is working on expanding AIS coverage throughout the lakes into traditionally dead areas, especially in Georgian Bay. Scott reported on the issue of the Port of Windsor implementing a fee for using the Ojibway Anchorage in the Detroit River. The NELC continued the slow process of building awareness and creating contacts within government, at both the state and national levels. The passage of the US Infrastructure Bill, has increased funding for the maritime sector. Nathan Dawson of Thunder Bay Lodge #16 is working with the Canadian Hydrographic Service as they use an autonomous survey vessel in northern Lake Superior in preparation for surveying the Canadian Arctic. Scott noted that 2022 will remain challenging. "Priorities remain the completion of a new lock in Sault Ste. Marie as well as the USCG acquiring a new heavy icebreaker for the Great Lakes."

PGP **Russ Brohl** presented the Scholarship Committee report. This year's awards went to Canadian Cadet **Matthew Merrifield**, US Cadet **Logan Vasicek** (read his thank-you on page 5), and Hawsepiper **Alexander Murtha**. The Scholarship Committee is again soliciting donations from local lodges and individuals so that the program will continue to provide important funds for future licensed mariners.

Paul Jagenow gave the Historian's report, which included a listing of Ship Masters' plaques (*shown on p. 6*) displayed at seven locations around the Great Lakes, and an extensive spreadsheet listing all Grand Lodge elected and appointed officers each year throughout ISMA's history as well as convention locations, number of active lodges and estimated

After lengthy discussion, the wording in a Constitutional amendment to revise the Cadet membership category, proposed by Chicago Lodge #3, was changed to include mariners actively pursuing a license. The revision narrowly passed; further change is expected to be made in 2023 to add clarification to the membership category's name.

ing more community-involved with adopting USS *Toledo*. USS *Toledo* (SSN-769) is a Los Angeles-class nuclear-powered attack submarine and the third U.S. Naval vessel named for the city of Toledo. She was launched on August 28, 1993, and commissioned on February 24, 1995.

In 2014 while in command of USS *Toledo*, Capt. **Majewski** brought several sailors from the sub to Toledo where they visited schools, hospitals, area attractions, met with city officials, etc. "Visits to the classrooms inspired students to want to learn more about not only the armed forces, but the maritime industry as well. Anything we can do to plant the seeds for the next generation workforce in the maritime industry is help-ful," he said.

"We would like to lead the way to help bring officers and sailors from the ship to Toledo so they can learn first-hand about the city their sub represents," said Lodge #9 President **Rick Brown**. "Other communities with submarines named after their cities are already doing this. We see many advantages to adopting USS *Toledo*. At some point the submarine will be decommissioned, and we'd like to play a role in bringing USS *Toledo* to our port when her service is completed."

GLMTF Calls for More Icebreaking Capacity on Lakes

On February 2, 2022, the Great Lakes Maritime Task Force (GLMTF) issued a press release, "Lack of Coast Guard Icebreaking Disrupts Supply Chain and Delays Soo Lock Dewatering." In part, the release says:

> Despite a relatively mild and delayed onset of winter in the Great Lakes, US-flag "lakers" were hampered by a lack of Coast Guard icebreaking assets. A total of 750,000 tons of carrying capacity for iron ore, coal and cement were delayed. 20 voyages were delayed for a total of 325 hours. "The inefficiency introduced into the Great Lakes Navigation System by inadequate Coast Guard icebreaking resources impacts the carriers, their customers and the entire North American manufacturing supply chain," said Jim Weakley, President of GLMTF and the Lake Carriers' Association. He continued, "The men and women of the US Coast Guard do the best they can with the resources they are provided. Unfortunately, they do not have enough icebreakers to keep the system operating efficiently." Budget reconciliation legislation now being considered in the US Senate would provide the Coast Guard with funding for an additional Great Lakes icebreaker.

Industry Newsbriefs ---

- The US Coast Guard's National Maritime Center (NMC) receives more than 50,000 applications annually for Merchant Mariner Credentials (MMCs). On average, more than 50 percent of those applications are incomplete, causing delays in processing and frustration for mariners. The five most common reasons applications are delayed include: 1) certificates and documents are missing or incorrect; 2) incomplete or incorrect application; 3) sea service documentation incorrect or missing signatures; 4) fees not paid or incorrect; 4) drug screen missing, incomplete or incorrect. - Several ports around the Lakes reported tonnage increases for 2021 compared with 2020. HOPA Ports saw tonnage increase by nine percent at Hamilton and Oshawa. The Port of Cleveland has reported a 69 percent increase in tonnage across its docks in 2021, including increases in goods both in and out of containers and iron ore shipments. Port of Duluth-Superior tonnage rebounded by 27 percent over a pandemic-induced low in 2020. The Port of Toledo saw a 22.1 percent tonnage increase in 2021 from 2020, and in fact, the 11,428,753 tons of cargo was the most through the port since 2011.
- The St. Lawrence Seaway Management Corporation (SLSMC) has announced a toll rate increase of 2 percent for the 2022 navigation season. View the revised toll schedule at <u>https://greatlakes-seaway.com/en/commercial</u> <u>-shipping/tolls-schedule/</u>.
- The US Coast Guard's National Merchant Marine Personnel Advisory Committee (N-MERPAC) will hold three upcoming subcommittee meetings covering: Sexual Harassment and Sexual Assault-Prevention and Culture Change in the Merchant Marine on February 16-17; STCW Convention and Code Review on February 22-23; and Military Education, Training, and Assessment for STCW and National Mariner Endorsements on March 2.
- Toronto plans to replace its fleet of aging ferries with fully electric vessels. A newly-passed initiative mandates that the city transition 20 percent of its fleet to zero emissions by 2025, and 50 percent by 2030. Read more at <u>https://professionalmariner.com/?</u> s=Toronto+electric+ferries.

- On January 31, 2022, the US Coast Guard Office of Commercial Vessel Compliance issued a reminder to towing vessel owners and operators that the deadline for 100% Subchapter M phase-in is approaching. Owners and operators are responsible for ensuring that all their

The USCG announced in the *Federal Register* that is has issued a final rule, effective January 21, 2022, to make technical and editorial corrections throughout Titles 33 and 46 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). These changes will update authority citations, correct errors, update contact information, and make other non-substantive amendments that improve the clarity of the CFR.
