Detroit Lodge #7 member Capt. **Elmer V. Dunn** (#10349) passed away on April 18, 2014, just ten days before his 102nd birthday. His career on the Great Lakes spanned six decades, mostly aboard Ford Motor Company vessels. Services were held on April 22.

Georgian Bay-Huronia Lodge #15 member and 2014 ISMA Grand Chaplain Capt. **Robert B. Hull** passed away suddenly while in Thunder Bay, Ontario, on May 2, 2014, at the age of 59. **Bob** was a 1976 graduate of Georgian College (where he also was an instructor), and most recently worked as a pilot with Great Lakes Pilotage Authority – District 3. **Bob** and his wife of over 35 years, **Julianne**, regularly attended ISMA conventions and were strong supporters of ISMA. In addition to his recent appointment as Grand Chaplain, **Bob** was also

serving as Lodge #15 secretary-treasurer at the time of his passing. Services were held on May 10. In addition to **Julianne**, survivors include sons **James** and **Caleb**. On Friday, May 2, Captain Robert Bruce Hull entered the perfect harbor of rest... Bob was a member of the first graduating class of the Marine Navigation Technology program at Georgian College... He sailed with Misener Transportation as an officer and master, and also was shore superintendent during his time with this company... In 1991, Bob assumed the role of a full-time professor of navigation at Georgian College. For the last 20 years, he served as a pilot with the Great Lakes Pilotage Authority in District 3 and the Welland Canal... He was a founding member of Georgian Bay-Huronia Lodge #15 of the International Ship Masters Association... He was known throughout the Great Lakes marine community.

Marine Transportation System Public Discussion

The US Coast Guard, US Army Corps of Engineers, and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration are cosponsoring "Future of Navigation – 21st Century Waterways" public listening sessions in several locations across the US. These meetings provide a venue for open communications between various Federal agencies and US Marine Transportation System (MTS) stakeholders. They will provide MTS users and stakeholders an opportunity to express their needs for navigational information and service delivery systems necessary to improve safety and efficiency of maritime transportation. A listening session will be held on June 12, 2014, at 5 pm, at the DoubleTree Hotel in Port Huron, MI.

Ballast Water Challenges Continue

The Great Lakes Maritime Task Force has sent a letter to US legislators participating in the Intra-Parliamentary Group meeting with Canadian government personnel in Ottawa, ON, beginning June 6, 2014. The letter details objections to Canada's proposed ballast water regulations, which, if implemented, could be disastrous for Great Lakes shipping. Stay tuned...

WRRDA Passes

Following the 412-4 vote in the US House of Representatives on May 20, 2014, and the 91-7 vote in the Senate on May 22, Congress approved H.R. 3080, the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA). The bill contains provisions that will significantly reduce the dredging backlog on the Great Lakes by increasing the amount spent on maintaining deep-draft ports and waterways, and designating the Great Lakes a "navigation system" for the purposes of maintenance dredging. WRRDA requires the government to increase national harbor maintenance funding, reaching 100 percent of the Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund (HMTF) revenues by 2025.

GREAT LAKES LEGISLATOR OF THE YEAR

Michigan Congressman **Bill Huizenga** was named 2014 Great Lakes Legislator of the Year by the Great Lakes Maritime Task Force. The annual award is presented to a legislator who has helped advance shipping on the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Seaway.

Huizenga's district includes Michigan ports that are suffering from the dredging crisis such as Muskegon and Grand Haven. "Congressman Huizenga has shown incredible resolve in addressing the dredging crisis on the Great Lakes," said James H. I. Weakley, President of GLMTF as well as Lake Carriers' Association. "His laser-like focus on the issue is one of the big reasons the Water Resources Reform and Development Act (WRRDA)... contains provisions key to ending the dredging crisis. The bill not only calls for more funding for dredging, but designates the Great Lakes a system in terms of dredging, and that in itself should put the Lakes on an even footing with other waterways."

Huizenga is also a strong supporter of adequate US Coast Guard icebreaking resources on the Lakes, especially noteworthy in light of the very harsh 2013-14 winter and the difficult spring breakout that followed.

USCG Requests Comments on Rulemaking – Special Load Line Exemption for Lake Michigan

In order to promote barge transportation of certain agricultural products and cargoes, petitioners have requested that the US Coast Guard create a load line-exempted route along the eastern shore of Lake Michigan. This would effectively extend the existing Chicago (Calumet Harbor), IL, to Burns Harbor, IN, exemption up the eastern shore of Lake Michigan to Muskegon, MI. Restrictions would be similar to those for the existing exempted route along the western shore between Calumet Harbor and Milwaukee, WI. Public comments are encouraged. Comments and related material can be submitted online via http://www.regulations.gov on or before August 25, 2014. When submitting comments, include the docket number USCG-2013-0954. Senators Urge Re-Evaluation of New Lock at Soo

On May 22, 2014, a bi-partisan group of 11 Great Lakes Senators signed a letter urging the US Army Corps of Engineers to reevaluate the benefit-cost ratio of building another Poe-sized lock at the Soo. The letter urged the Corps to reassess the true value of a second maximum-size lock. Led by Sen. Carl Levin (D-MI), the group included Debbie Stabenow (D-MI), Tammy Baldwin (D-WI), Dan Coats (R-IN), Al Franken (D-MN), Amy Klobuchar (D-MN), Joe Donnelly (D-IN), Rob Portman (R-OH), Sherrod Brown (D-OH), Charles E. Schumer (D-NY), and Ron Johnson (R-WI).

Former Congressman Oberstar Passes

Congressman **James L. Oberstar**, who represented Minnesota's iron ore mining and shipping industries in the US House from 1974 to 2011, passed away on May 3, 2014, at the age of 79. "Great Lakes shipping has lost its greatest friend and staunchest supporter," said Lake Carriers' Association President **Jim Weak-ley**. "He was at the forefront of every effort to make waterborne commerce on the Lakes and Seaway safer and more efficient." Great Lakes Maritime Task Force named **Oberstar** Great Lakes Legislator of the Year in 1999, and Interlake Steamship Company renamed MV *Hon. James L. Oberstar* in his honor in 2011.

License Advancement Program

Twin Ports Lodge #12 member Christopher Edyvean has been the instructor for the annual winter Great Lakes License Advancement Program (LAP) at Maritime Institute of Technology and Graduate Studies (MITAGS). The four-week course prepares license candidates for an original deck officer's credential or an upgrade. Christopher reports that the following completed the program on February 12, 2014: Mike King, Dustin Darby, Eric Darby, and Kyle Joyce of Interlake Steamship Company; Shawn Pavlovich and Dan Manning of Grand River Navigation; and Phil Slominski of the NY State Barge Canal Corp.

Industry Newsbriefs -

The US Maritime Administration hosted the Second National Maritime Strategy Symposium: Domestic Shipping Opportunities on May 6, 2014, in Washington, DC.

St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation Administrator **Betty Sutton** spoke about the Seaway in Lorain, OH, on April 16, 2014. Lorain was one of the cities she represented when she served in the US House of Representatives. She suggested that the Great Lakes region, a manufacturing and agricultural hub, be called the "Opportunity Belt." Cooperation between cities and ports is critical, she said. "The Great Lakes region is a vibrant and dynamic economic environment that is primed for further use and economic development. But, we have to make it happen."

The city of Thunder Bay, ON, is hosting the Great Lakes St. Lawrence Cities Initiative's Annual General Meeting June 18-20, 2014. More information is at www.thunderbay2014.com.
