

Lakes Pilots Association Offers Reward for Recreational Fisherman/Boater

On July 2, 2017, a recreational fisherman purposely impeded two downbound vessels at Huron Cut Buoys 1 & 2 in Port Huron, causing both vessels to have to take extreme evasive action. One vessel was ocean-going under the guidance of an American pilot, and the other following behind was the *Lee A. Tregurtha*. The boater purposely maneuvered into the path of the *Tregurtha* as it was taking action to avoid it. The boater screamed obscenities to both ship captains, and told one to get out of "his" channel.

While boaters and commercial ship incidents are nothing new, this one is particularly disturbing in that the boater was intentionally trying to impede the ships with malice. Lakes Pilots Association is addressing this and offering a small reward to help find this fisherman.

It seems problems with fishermen are increasing. Lakes Pilots is hosting a meeting with US Coast Guard Sector Detroit, Station Port Huron, US and Canadian police authories, and some local sportfishing associations at the Lakes Pilots Association's office on August 8 to discuss the problem and possible remedies.

Lakes Pilots has offered a \$200 reward to the first person to get the registration number of the boat involved, leading to the posi-



tive identification of the boat owner. The boat is 16-foot, grey or white aluminum, starboard console, walk-through windshield with black accent stripe below deck edge, vintage 40 to 60-hp Johnson outboard with orange stripe, black electric trolling motor on bow, two fishing nets

Report other incidents in the St. Clair/Detroit River system and fax a commercial Navigation Obstruction Report (CNO Report) to the USCG.

Industry Newsbriefs -

- On August 3, 2017, ADM Paul Zukunft, Commandant of the US Coast Guard, hosted the Commissioner of the Canadian Coast Guard, Jeffery Hutchinson, in a one-day "summit" at the USCG sector field office in Grand Haven, MI. The meeting was an opportunity for both Coast Guards to continue to strengthen their long history of cooperation across their shared maritime border. The meeting included signing of the 2017 update to the Joint Marine Pollution Contingency Plan, which serves as a coordinated system for planning, preparedness, and responding to harmful substance incidents in the contiguous waters along the shared maritime borders of the US and Canada.
- On August 2, 2017, the US Coast Guard held a change-ofcommand ceremony for the Ninth District in Cleveland. Vice Adm Karl L. Schultz, USCG Atlantic Area commander, presided over the transfer of command of the Ninth District from Rear Adm June E. Ryan to Rear Adm Joanna Nunan. Following the change-of-command, a retirement ceremony was held for Rear Adm Ryan, presided over by Adm Paul F. Zukunft, Commander of the US Coast Guard.
- Effective August 1, 2017, US Coast Guard Sector Lake Michigan established two safety zones on Lake Michigan, Calumet Harbor, Chicago, in order to protect vessels and persons from the potential hazards associated with a lakebed rock removal operation involving explosives. Both Lake Michigan safety zones will be enforced from August 1 to December 16; however, safety zone two will only be enforced for approximately 30 minutes each day. - Preparations were underway during the first week of August to demolish the Huron County Marine Museum in Goderich, ONT. The county determined the number of visitors and the cost of bringing the property up to current standards did not justify its continued operation.
- Interim Detroit/Wayne County Port Authority executive director is Kyle Burleson, replacing John Loftus. Burleson will hold the position from August 1, 2017, to February 1, 2018, while a permanent replacement is sought.
- The US Coast Guard's National Maritime Center (NMC) is requesting feedback regarding their new website, which was launched on June 29, 2017. - On July 26, 2017, Rear Adm Paul Thomas, US Coast Guard's Assistant Commandant for Prevention Policy, turned over that position to Rear Adm John Nadeau. Rear Adm Thomas then assumed command of the US Coast Guard's Eighth District.
