On June 19, 2020, several members of Detroit Lodge #7 recently participated in a Sea Cadet training program. Capt. **Luke Clyburn**, Grand 2nd Vice President and Master of the training vessel *Pride of Michigan*, invited fellow lodge members to assist in the training session at the vessel's Clinton River berth. (**Luke** is president of the Noble Odyssey Foundation, which operates *Pride of Michigan*.) **Ray Oset**, Lodge #7 Secretary-Treasurer, conducted a class on marine navigation. PGP Capt. **Tom McMullen** spoke to the cadets about

Lodge #7 Secretary-Treasurer, spoke about his career in the marine supply business at J. W. Westcott Co, including operation of the Detroit mail boat. The cadets showed a great deal of interest in what a career on the Great Lakes entails – from work conditions, potential wages, deck licenses vs. engine room licenses, working up the hawsepipe vs. attending a maritime academy, and so on.

Grand Traverse Lodge No. 23:

Grand Traverse Lodge #23 President and PGP Mark Mather attended the ceremony re-designating Traverse City as one of only 28 Coast Guard Cities in the United States. Speakers included US Senator Gary Peters, Mayor Jim Caruthers, and Air Station Traverse City Commander Chuck Webb. Traverse

City became an official Coast Guard City in 2010, and each city so designated must reapply for that status every five years. Incidentally, Air Station Traverse City will celebrate its 75th Anniversary in Traverse City on November 15.



Industry Newsbriefs -

- For the fifth time in seven years, the Port of Monroe (MI) has received the Robert J. Lewis Pacesetter Award (for 2019), given by the St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corp. This award is given to US ports in the Seaway system which increase their international tonnage compared with the previous year. During the 2019 shipping season, Monroe saw some of the port's most diverse cargo ever. Currently, in 2020, wind energy components are a big part of Monroe's business.
- On June 24, 2020, the St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corp. (SLSDC) announced that Gary Croot will assume the position of Associate Administrator of the SLSDC Massena, NY, operations/facilities on July 5. He replaces Thomas Lavigne, who is retiring after 40 years of service.
- On June 25, 2020, the International Maritime Organization (IMO) celebrated the 10th anniversary of the Day of the Seafarer. Supported by other maritime groups, the IMO called for all countries to recognize seafarers as key workers and to facilitate crew changes.
- On June 30, 2020, Transport Canada issued Ship Safety Bulletin #18/2020 to provide guidance regarding the mobility of asymptomatic marine sector workers during the COVID -19 pandemic. Read the full document at <u>https://</u>

- The 2019-2020 St. Lawrence Seaway Management Corp. Annual Corporate Summary has been posted to the SLSMC website at <u>https://greatlakes-seaway.com/wp-content/</u> <u>uploads/2020/07/slsmc_ar2020_en.pdf</u>.
- On July 8, 2020, Tracy R. Zea was named President and CEO of the Waterways Council, Inc.
- As part of the Canadian Coast Guard improvement of the E-NAV system in Canada, Digital Sailing Directions are now available at no cost on the Fisheries and Oceans Canada website at the following: <u>http://charts.gc.ca/publications/</u> <u>sailingdirections-instructionsnautiques-eng.asp</u>.
- In June, the US Army Corps of Engineers released an updated Powerpoint presentation on the new Soo Lock. The previous presentation, from April, can be found here: <u>https://www.lre.usace.army.mil/Portals/69/docs/New% 20Soo% 20Quarterly%20Update%20I6%20April%202020.pdf</u>.
- Over 60 years ago, in 1959, *The Long Ships Passing* was produced. This classic Great Lakes shipping video can be viewed on YouTube at <u>https://youtu.be/C80jtA2nUyA</u>, courtesy of the Detroit Historical Society.
- Through June 2020, total shipping tonnage through the Port of Duluth-Superior was down 29 percent from a year ago. However, June numbers were 6 percent higher than in May. Grain shipments are 22 percent above the five-season average, but iron ore was down by 10 percent.
- Canadian ports and the St. Lawrence Seaway reported improving cargo shipments in June 2020, fueled by grain exports, agricultural inputs, and a recovery in construction materials.
- On June 30, 2020, the US Coast Guard switched off the last Differential Global Positioning System (DGPS) signals after more than 25 years.
- In a July 14, 2020, press release, Lake Carriers' Association expressed appreciation for the US House Appropriations Committee approval of \$123 million for construction of the new Soo Lock. This would be the largest single year amount received so far in a fiscal year for one of the largest infrastructure projects ever in the Great Lakes region. LCA "applauds the House Committee for the approval of the 'Energy and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Act, 2021."" - On July 17, 2020, the Port of Indiana-Burns Harbor celebrated its 50th anniversary.
- On July 15, 2020, the US House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee approved HR 7575, the Water Resources Development Act of 2020. It passed the US House on July 29.

It was noted in July that the most famous nautical smile on the Halifax waterfront is looking for a new home, as *Theodore Tugboat (right)* went up for sale. Its price was listed at \$495,000. As of July 21, there were reportedly four interested parties.



The US National Park Service is planning to repair/replace the north and south congrete service at land

north and south concrete seawalls at Perry's Victory International Peace Memorial Park on South Bass Island in Lake Erie.

- On July 29, 2020, the US Coast Guard Waterways Policies and Activities Division released Marine Safety Information Bulletin (MSIB) 17-20 to highlight the impacts of on-water mass gatherings to the public and maritime transportation system. These gatherings are primarily a boating safety issue. As these types of marine events grow in popularity, the USCG will work with its port partners to ensure safety of the marine transportation system. These actions will take into account health and safety factors including but not limited to local COVID-19 and social distance guidelines as well as current unrest. - The US Office of Merchant Mariner Credentialing is seeking applications for membership positions representing credentialed ratings in the National Merchant Marine Personnel Advisory Committee (N-MERPAC). N-MERPAC replaces the Merchant Marine Personnel Advisory Committee (MERPAC). On May 15, 2020, the USCG published a request for applications for membership in N-MERPAC. Due to a lack of applications for positions representing credentialed ratings, the USCG is resoliciting applications effective July 31. - An August 1, 2020, article in the Duluth News Tribune, "Jones Act draws critics, defenders," included input from Jim Weakley, President of Lake Carriers' Association. The article, however, did not include the important national security aspect of the Jones Act. The Jones Act celebrates its 100th birthday this year. - On August 6, 2020, the US Coast Guard announced that it is seeking input from mariners who hold Qualified Member of the Engine Department (QMED) endorsements to validate information gathered as part of a Job Task Analysis. The USCG will use the results in consultation with industry to evaluate and update examination content for QMED endorsements. Mariners holding QMED endorsements will receive an email containing a link to the survey. For more information, see <u>https://</u>

- In recent weeks, longshore workers at the Port of Montreal carried out a series of strike mandates and, on August 10, 2020, called an indefinite strike. This jeopardizes the economic sector of logistics and freight transport, which in Greater Montreal alone, accounts for over 70,000 direct jobs, 50,000 indirect jobs, and 6000 businesses. On August 17, the Quebec and Ontario governments asked Ottawa to intervene, which it declined to do. On August 21, the smaller of two striking unions reached a tentative deal to end their strike. The Port of Halifax has seen a jump in cargo due to the Montreal strike.
