Thunder Bay Lodge No. 16:

Captain **Gerry Dawson**, President of Thunder Bay Lodge No. 16, and President of Thunder Bay Tug Services Limited, participated in a unique operation in the Port of Thunder Bay. Two autonomous vessels were deployed to record soundings in order to determine water depth. The autonomous vessels were controlled by pilots in Belfast, Ireland. **Gerry** and his crew assisted a technician by escorting the vessels out past the

breakwall. They were then controlled by the pilots in Belfast. Each unit will scan a one-kilometer swath at a depth of 182 metres. The units have been crated up and sent to Nova Scotia. They will return in the spring of 2021 to resume the project, which is in charge of the Canadian Hydrographic Service.

Capt. Earl McKnight, member of Niagara District Lodge #20, passed away on November 12, 2020. Earl was a captain for Canada Steamship Lines for 30 years; following that, he became a pilot with Great Lakes Pilotage Authority, a position he held for more than 20 years. During this year's pandemic, museums have faced many challenges, including closures, loss of revenue and restricted attendance. The National Museum of the Great Lakes in Toledo has responded by expanding their virtual programming. On December 5, 2020, the Christmas Tree Ship (tugboat courtesy of Geo. Also, on December 16, at 1900 EST, NMGL will present an online talk, "Transforming Interlake for the Future," by Interlake Steamship Company President **Mark Barker**. He will discuss the ongoing construction of Interlake's newest vessel, the first new US Great Lakes bulk carrier built in over 35 years. You can find information at www.nmgl.org/events.

Industry Newsbriefs -

- ➤ On December 10, 2020, the Duluth Seaway Port Authority announced that it had finalized its acquisition of the Duluth Lake Port dock on Rice's Point. The 7.5-acre dock property and 3.5-acre slip date back to the 1880s when Duluth Imperial Mill built the site's initial flour mill and grain elevators. The facility was last used for grain in 2015. Future use of the property is still in the planning phase.
- On December 9, 2020, Cleveland-Cliffs Inc. announced completion of the acquisition of the operations of ArcelorMittal USA LLC, thus forming the largest flat-rolled steel producer in North America.
- A multimodal hub in Thorold is the first step in Niagara Ports' Welland Canal strategy. The Thorold Multimodal Hub is on the site of a former paper manufacturing facility on the east side of the canal. The project is a partnership between Hamilton Oshawa Port Authority and Bioveld Canada Inc.
- On December 7, 2020, the United States Great Lakes Shipping Association in Cleveland announced that, effective January 1, 2021, USCG Rear Admiral (retired) John E. Crowley, Jr., will become Executive Director of USGLSA. He succeeds Cleveland Lodge #4 member Stuart H. Theis, who is retiring after 14 years at the helm of the trade association.
- ➤ Progress on the FY2021 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), H.R. 6395, S. 4049, was made in both the US House and Senate during the first week of December 2020. Within this legislation is the Coast Guard Authorization Act which includes authorization of \$160 million for a new Great Lakes icebreaker. The NDAA also included the Maritime Administration reauthorization bill.
- Also progressing during the first week of December was the Water Resources Development Act of 2020 (WRDA), H.R. 7575, S. 1811. The legislation includes Harbor Maintenance Trust Fund distribution, as well as text of H.R. 4470/S. 4870 which would rename the Saint Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation to "Great Lakes St. Lawrence Seaway Development Corporation" to better reflect the regional focus of the agency. The WRDA alto includes authorizations for US Army Corps of Engineers projects, including modification of the Brandon Road Lock and Dam in Joliet, IL, to control the migration of Asian carp from the inland rivers to the Great Lakes.
- Seaway Notice 21-2020, "Closing of the 2020 Navigation Season," notes that the clearance date, as defined in Seaway Practices and Procedures, is December 20. For the Montre-al-Lake Ontario Section, operational surcharges will be waived on December 21, 22, 23 and 24. Any transit after December 24, if permitted, is subject to prior written agreement. For the Welland Canal, any transit after December 26, if permitted, is subject to prior written agreement. The Soo Locks are scheduled to close on January 15, 2021. Industry Newsbriefs, continued

- Great Lakes-St. Lawrence Seaway shipping reported improvements in October 2020. Through October, Canadian grain shipments were up by 21 percent from the same time last year. US grain shipments had increased by 10.7 percent
- The St. Lawrence Seaway Management Corporation reported that through October 2020, total cargo volume was down by 7.88 percent from 2019. Vessel transits numbered 2905, down 11.51 percent, or 378 transits, from 2019.
- In October 2020, Transport Canada issued Bulletin No. 21/2020, "Revised Temporary Measures Regarding Marine Personnel Certificates, Discharge Books, Marine Medical Certificates & Marine Counter Services." Any certificate of competency, certificate of proficiency, examiner certificate or training certificate expiring between October 2019 and March 2021 is granted an extension until March 31, 2021. - ➢ On October 27, 2020, the US Coast Guard announced in the Federal Register that it is proposing new base Great Lakes pilotage rates for the 2021 shipping season as well as revisions to calculation methodology. The USCG estimates that this proposed rule would result in a four percent net increase in pilotage costs compared to the 2020 season. - On December 10, 2020, the *Toledo Blade* reported that effective this month -- for the first time in 35 years -- silt, clay, and other sediment dredged from the Toledo Harbor shipping channel won't be dumped into the open waters of western Lake Erie's North Maumee Bay. - > Thunder Bay Lodge # 16 Secretary-Treasurer Gene Onchulenko reports that Thunder Bay has had a busy year with grain shipments. "With the salty season just about over, we will have cleared 177 salties by December 20."




