At the time of his death he was working at the University of Michigan as an Operating Room Manager for the East Ann Arbor Surgery Center. Just this afternoon I received news from Wade Streeter of Port Huron Lodge No. 2 of the death of Charles (Chick) Ferriss, age 55, who passed away unexpectedly in his Detroit home on Friday, March 14. Chick was a longtime member of Detroit Lodge No. 7 (1982-2001). He transferred to Bay City Lodge No. 5 in 2001 and then to Port Huron Lodge No. 2 where he was a member at the time of his death. His pennant number was 10339. Chick was a lifelong tugboat owner/operator, as were his father and uncles before him. He worked in his early years for the Gaelic Tugboat Co., as well as part time for other companies around the Great Lakes. In 1974 he founded Ferriss Marine Contracting. He had business ties to various tugs throughout his career including the famous Detroit fireboat John Kendall, the Protector (Nicole S.), the former Saginaw River harbor tug Frederick T. Kellers and the well-known Detroit harbor tug Magnetic. He is survived by his mother Nancy and two children Mitchell and Melissa. Chick will be cremated and per his request there will be no funeral arrangements.

Our longtime **lodge marshal Ron Nelson**, who has been in assisted care due to Parkinson's disease, **has been hospitalized** suffering from MRSA (methicillin resistant staphylococcus aureus).
