Wilma has been active at Mariners' for over 50 years. She is the widow of Bishop Richard Ingalls, who passed away in 2006. Bishop Ingalls served as Rector of Mariners' for 41 years and was a longtime Chaplain of Detroit Lodge No. 7. Wilma is also the mother of member Rick Ingalls, Jr., who succeeded his father as both Rector of Mariners' and Chaplain of Detroit Lodge No. 7. Fr. Rick is now Rector Emeritus and retired in Florida. Wilma was a lifetime member of the lodge's now inactive Ladies Auxiliary. Congratulations to Wilma on this special recognition of her long years of service to Detroit's "Maritime Sailors' Cathedral." The <u>Mariners' Church Newsletter</u> of July, 2015 also had photos showing the honor guard and Ludington Award recipients at the Blessing of the Fleet last March. BOBLO BOAT CAPTAIN TO APPEAR AT GIFTS AFLOAT ON JULY 18

Memories of excursions to Bob-Lo Island and midnight cruises on Lake Ste. Clair will be stirred on Saturday, July 18th at Gifts Afloat, 24601 Jefferson Avenue, St. Clair Shores, Michigan. Gifts Afloat is hosting a promotion of Great Lakes maritime heritage with Captain Arthur Herrala on hand to talk with the public from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Over the years Captain Art worked on the overnight passenger vessel, Greater Detroit of the Detroit & Cleveland Navigation Company, and he sailed around the lakes on the cruise ship S.S. South American. He worked delivering iron ore while on the freighter Charles Dunlap, and in 1955 joined the McCarthy Steamship Company. He sailed from Detroit on the converted freighter George H. Ingalls as it carried loads of 411 brand new automobiles on a special 'flight deck' to various ports on the Great Lakes. Captain Art later joined Browning Company's Bob-Lo Fleet that cruised the eighteen miles from the Detroit dock to Bob-Lo Island, and took midnight cruises on the waters of Lake Ste. Clair. Captain Art retired in 1991, after putting in a number of years as the captain of the S.S. Ste. Claire and the S.S. Columbia.

A special Bob-Lo memory item will be available in the form of a full color signed and numbered limited edition print by the marine artist Jerry Crowley. The 24 by30 inch print depicts the S.S. Columbia leaving the Woodward Avenue dock in 1909. The view also shows the S.S. Tashmoo ready to depart on the daily trip across Lake Ste. Clair and up the St. Clair River to Port Huron. The print is available for \$30.00 as a fundraiser for the Great Lakes Maritime Institute. If a print is purchased on Saturday July 18th, Captain Herrala who served as the captain of the S.S. Columbia will personally autograph it.
