

Many will miss Fr. Marshall

Marshall was "well known and well loved," according to Fr. Anthony Bologna, a classmate.

The two grew up together, as they both entered Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit at age 14. "He was well loved in the seminary by

his classmates and seminarians in general," recalled Fr. Bologna, who is now in residence at St. Gabriel Parish, Detroit.

Fr. Marshall was "an ordinary priest in kind of an extraordinary way," Fr. Bologna said. "He did what was expected of a priest without fanfare. without ostentation, but

he was extraordinary in the way he lived his life as a priest."

Fr. Bologna said part of what made his friend so extraordinary was that he never varied from orthodox Catholic teaching.

"He lived his first portion of his priesthood life pre-(Second) Vatican Council, and then when Vatican II came into being he could see the wisdom of the changes that the Church was making, so he accepted that," he explained.

Fr. Marshall also loved his fellow priests, he said, often traveling to visit friends who were retired.

That love spilled over the people served, especially those at St. Dorothy, the Warren parish he founded. When Fr. Marshall retired, Fr. Bologna said, a party was held for him at the Pope Leo XIII Knights of

WARREN - Fr. Raymond Columbus Hall in Eastpointe. "The place was just filled because they loved their pastor," he added.


Fr. Marshall died Jan. 28 of a stroke. He was 79.

Born May 30, 1918, in Detroit to Raymond and Viola (Kaiser) Marshall, he attended St. Catherine

Grade School, Sacred Heart Seminary high school and college, and Mount St. Mary Seminary, Norwood, Ohio.

He was ordained Dec. 18, 1943.

Fr. Marshall served as an assistant pastor at the Patronage of St. Joseph (1944-50) and St. Mary of Redford (1959-55)



He was the first recipient of the Cardinal Mooney Award in 1997. The honor enabled him to study for three months at the Marianella Pastoral Centre in Dublin, Ireland.

Fr. Marshall is survived by a brother, Donald; and two sisters, Joanne and Mary Rita.

Cardinal Adam Maida celebrated the funeral Mass Jan. 31 at St. Dorothy Church. Burial was in Mount Olivet Cemetery, Detroit.

Founding priest at St. Dorothy's

WARREN - The Rev. Raymond Marshall, the founding priest at St. Dorothy Catholic Church in Warren, died Wednesday, Jan. 28, 1998, after a stroke.

Fr. Marshall, 79, had been living at St. Raphael, in Garden City, since he retired from St. Dorothy in 1988. He served at St. Dorothy for 28 years, and also worked at the Patronage of St. Joseph and St. Matthew in Detroit. He was ordained Dec. 18, 1943.

"He was a gem," said Shirley Henk, a member of St. Dorothy. "He shared many things with the parish."

Henk said Fr. Marshall attended all committee meetings and was available whenever people needed help.

Fr. Marshall won the Cardinal Mooney award in 1972, which included an opportunity to study in Dublin, Ireland.

He is survived by two sisters, Mary Rita and Joanne; and a brother, Donald.

Visitation will be from 1-3 p.m. today at Verheyden-Duross Funeral Home, 28499 Schoenherr, Warren. It will continue from 5-9 p.m. at St. Dorothy Catholic Church, 12255 Frazho, in Warren. A scripture service will be held at 7 p.m.

A mass will be celebrated at 10 a.m. Saturday at the church. Burial will follow at Mt. Olivet Cemetery, in Detroit.
